I am thankful for the leadership, officers, and key volunteers who help organize and plan the events and ministries. Our outreach events have many moving parts, which take many hours of planning and executing.


I am thankful for Leann as we work together to serve you through the WCBA office. She does an amazing job and is willing to tackle any project.
